- Catalyst Funding 2025-26
- One-time funding of up to \$30,000 for established K-12 afterschool and summer programs in Nebraska
- Looking to support established programs in greater
 Nebraska working to provide high-quality, locally sustainable
 learning experiences
- Funding will be provided to support program efforts in one or more of four goal areas

ELIGIBILITY

Applicant **MUST** be:

- Elementary, middle, and/or high school afterschool, before school, and/or summer program in Nebraska
- School-based or community organization-based
- Outside of the Lincoln and Omaha metro areas
- Established program working to provide high-quality, locally sustainable learning experiences Funding levels will be responsive to a program's needs, strengths, and capacity for innovation

GOAL 1: PROGRAM QUALITY

Facilitate continuous improvement processes to support high quality Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELOs) that engage relevant stakeholders.





GOAL 1: PROGRAM QUALITY

- Costs (wages, supplies, meals, travel, etc.) associated with:
 - Staff meetings, coaching, and trainings
 - Attending conferences
 - Youth advisory groups
 - Family engagement events
 - Community advisory teams
 - Connecting with neighboring programs around best practices in afterschool
- Director planning time
- Resources for aligning with quality frameworks



GOAL 2: SUSTAINABILITY

Increase and enhance efforts that promote local sustainability of partner Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELOs).





GOAL 2: SUSTAINABILITY

- Costs (wages, supplies, meals, travel, etc.) associated with:
 - Engaging district leaders, school admin, and teachers
 - Local partnership development and advisory groups
 - Development of a sustainability plan
 - Marketing and media campaigns
- Wages and trainings for high school and college-aged staff



GOAL 3: LOCAL ADVOCACY AND POLICY

Enhance practices that build local stakeholder knowledge of ELO impact and contribute to supportive policy structures.





GOAL 3: LOCAL POLICY AND ADVOCACY

- Costs (wages, supplies, meals, travel, etc.) associated with:
 - Development of annual advocacy plan
 - Staff education and PD around advocacy efforts
 - Media campaigns to reach state legislators, including site visits and communications outreach

Facilitate and enhance use of highquality programming that reflects youth interests and builds life skills.





GOAL 4: **INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMING**

- Costs (wages, supplies, meals, travel, etc.) associated with:
 - Conducting a Youth Brainstorming Session
 - Facilitating and implementing club/activity ideas from a Youth Brainstorming Session
 - Family engagement events connected to programming
 - Planning and implementation of innovative clubs/activities
 - Field trips related to what students are learning in clubs/activities



GOAL 4: **INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMING**

Preference in this goal area will be given to programming that aligns with BSB priority areas:

- Workforce development/career pathways
- Environmental education (gardening, hydroponics)
- Service-learning and youth leadership
- STEM family engagement
- Literacy

BSB WILL PROVIDE:

- Up to \$30,000 in funding
- Relationship-centered, goal focused coaching and technical assistance (TA) Coaching plans will be co-created with each program receiving funding based on their unique goals and needs.
- Access to regular professional development opportunities and quality resources to learn about best practices
- Resources to support long-term sustainability and alignment with statewide goals including workforce development, literacy, and attendance
 - We will continue to develop and deliver relevant resources in an everchanging Afterschool environment

REQUIREMENTS OF THOSE RECEIVING FUNDING:

- Attend virtual quarterly network meetings
- Agree to timely and clear communication with BSB team
- Host a Lights on Afterschool event
- Attend Advocacy Day in Lincoln hosted by BSB (spring 2026)
- 5-month and 11-month expenditure reports submitted via WebGrants
- 5-month and 11-month progress reports submitted via Qualtrics
- Depending on the goal area applied for, additional requirements may be included, such as: additional one-on-one coaching, development of a PD, sustainability, and/or advocacy plan, youth brainstorming session, etc.



APPLICATIONS

- Successful applications will be well thought out and strongly aligned with one or more of the goal areas (Quality, Sustainability, Policy, and Programming)
- We recommend collaboration with several members of your team (admin, directors, coordinators, parent councils, and other community stakeholders) to ensure 1) buy-in and alignment to your district/organization's goals and 2) capacity to execute plans
- If applying for the full \$30,000, we recommend applying for two or three goal areas
