Nebraska's Afterschool Programs: Galloping Forward

"Through rain or snow, or sleet or hail, we'll carry the mail. We will not fail."

Those famous words evoke the spirit of the historic Pony Express mail service, which had 38 stations in Nebraska, mostly nestled along the Platte River Valley. Two of these 1860s era stations still stand as National Park Service monuments in Gothenburg and at Rock Creek Station

I thought about this historic motto and spirit of commitment to the nation-bridging mission the Pony Express conveyed in light of the temporary uncertainty that erupted last week when the Federal funding freeze was announced via Executive Order and then quickly, thankfully, rescinded.

Nebraska's afterschool programs reflect the same can-do spirit as the Pony Express service and exist along a similar statewide course stretching from Omaha to Scottsbluff, albeit one with many more refueling stations wherever children and families seek learning experiences and care along the way.

And like our forbearers, despite whatever challenges - weather-related or otherwise - that emerge, Nebraska's Afterschool program staff also remain committed to their important mission to help spread the promise of the Good Life to youth, families and communities across our vast state. These vital programs provide young people opportunities to learn and

grow in safe and welcoming places after the end of the school day and in the summer when parents and caregivers are still busy at work, driving Nebraska's economy forward.

All of us at Beyond School Bells wanted to acknowledge the can-do, mission-driven spirit of the dedicated afterschool professionals who power afterschool and summer learning programs across Nebraska. What will afterschool programs receive:

- Virtual training sessions for facilitators, 1 hour
- Supplies and materials for each student per site
