

## Resources and Opportunities

**BSB Leverage Grant:**  
Application due February 26th

Beyond School Bells is also excited about our new grant program to support afterschool and summer programming across the state, the BSB Leverage Grants .

BSB Leverage Grants are intended to support Greater Nebraska Afterschool and Summer programs during the 2024/25 school year and the summer of 2025. The primary goal of this grant is to help grow and sustain new rural school-based ELO programs. Priority will be given to programs established in the last five years as well as programs serving high need communities, including schools with high concentrations of students residing in low-income households or facing other educational challenges.

The BSB Leverage grant program will be competitive and will provide a select group of ELO programs with one-year grants that begin at \$7,500, with a maximum award of up to \$50,000. While one-year grants, there is the possibility for additional years of funding in future years if funding is available. This grant requires local 1:1 leverage of BSB funds, including district contributions, community partners contributions, and other forms of leverage. Grant funds can support staffing, programming costs, parent/family engagement activities, supplies and sustainability work (outreach, marketing), but should be focused on providing hands on, engaged learning to youth participating in the program. The BSB Leverage grant will give grantees the ability to design the composition of their grant based on their local needs and capacity.

Retired teachers understand the pivotal role afterschool and summer programs play in providing youth with additional learning opportunities and crucial support beyond the regular school day and year. From creating safe, nurturing spaces at the end of the school day to facilitating hands-on projects, cooking classes, robotics clubs, memorable field trips, and much, much more, afterschool and summer programs contribute significantly to healthy youth development and community vitality and are indispensable for Nebraska's working parents and caregivers.

We need you to help us grow high quality, locally sustainable programs across the state. If you are or know a retired teacher, we suggest you reach out to an elementary or middle school in your community to inquire about their afterschool program. Once connected, ask to meet with the site director and explore their needs or propose a club idea that sparks your passion and ensures engagement with the youth in the program. Share your availability with the program director and, if you are interested in mentoring a high school staff member, let them know. Trust us - programs will be excited to see a fellow educator interested in being a part of their team!
