YOUTH BRAINSTORMING SHEETS






Share with ALL staff (Admin/teachers/ASP staff)

Discuss results during your site level/advisory team meetings

Develop club schedules based on their responses







WHY?

- Students give ideas on clubs and activities they like
- Get voice from other students
- Help lead and take ownership of the program

HOW IT WORKS

1. Create a 1 page application- send home with all students in your program.

2. Review packet

- 2nd through 4th graders
- In pairs, brainstorm about things they want to teach to their peers
- High school staff help students lead these activites throughout the semester


"IF OUR ACTIVITES AREN'T INTERESTING, THEY WON'T PARTICIPATE!"
