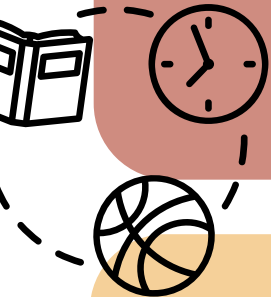

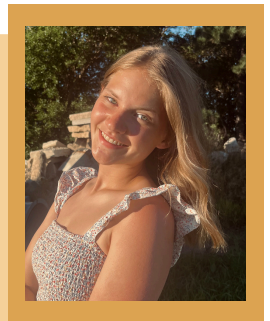


YLC PROJECT: TEACHING AGRICULTURE “AG IN THE CLASSROOM”

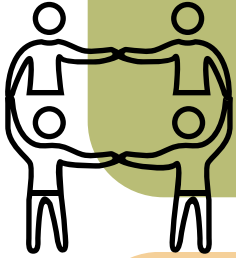

“SETTING A SUCCESSFUL PATH TO A TECH FUTURE”

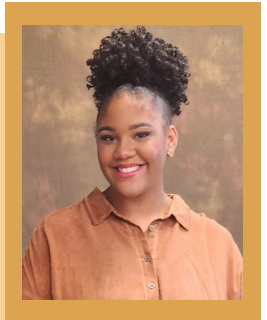
