A free, Nebraska-centric conference focused on supporting high-quality, locally sustainable afterschool and summer programs providing fun, engaging, student- and family-centered expanded learning opportunities.

With 2025's arrival, now is the time to <u>register</u> to attend Beyond School Bells' third Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) Innovation Invitational, which will be held from March 10 – 12th at UNL's Innovation Campus.


Program Spotlights

Tour of Nebraska Afterschool Programs

A celebration of high-quality afterschool and summer learning programs across Nebraska




Aspire for Greatness – a middle and high school program in Fremont focused on career exploration and mentorship.



Aspire for Greatness is an outstanding example of what programs can accomplish with local partnerships and a focus on youth voice and choice.

Open to 7th-12th graders (and youth up to age 19) in the Fremont area, Aspire for Greatness focuses on out-of-school enrichment and one-to-one mentoring. Youth enjoy meals, life skills education, physical activity, career exploration and much more. There is a strong focus on building self-worth and fostering community connections.



"Having a focus on youth voice and youth choice has allowed us to offer career speakers in areas they are interested in, offer occasional peer led lesson time, provide choice in clubs to participate in, have high school youth lead clubs, offer an optional dinner at the end of the daily program during the school year, provide family engagement events, started a high school Mock Trial team, and incorporate a youth leadership program with participants being peer leaders within the program (currently in the implementation stage)."

Go Beyond and Project Washkon







Continuing on the theme of partnership, we are excited to have collaborated with <u>Go Beyond</u> in 2024 and seen their impact grow into the afterschool world! Go Beyond is an organization dedicated to bringing together diverse groups of young people for self-discovery and community building through outdoor adventures and connecting to nature. Nearly one year ago, Go Beyond began their introduction to afterschool by partnering with the Walthill program, Project Washkon, to build a club for outdoor engagement in afterschool programs. They've centered youth voice and experience by leading activities that students enjoyed and could build upon – starting with using a compass and culminating with camping experiences based on students' own plans. Go Beyond has reminded us of the importance of slowing down, leaning into fun activities together, and creating opportunities for students to build

lasting memories. Later this year, BSB and Go Beyond will have a Camping Club guide to share based on experiences in 2024 and those to come in 2025. National Geographic Slingshot Challenge – Last Call! BSB Mini Grants Available to Support Projects



Last call for National Geographic Slingshot Challenge projects! The National Geographic Slingshot Challenge invites students aged 13-18 in teams of up to 6 students to submit a 1-minute video describing their innovative ideas for addressing local environmental challenges such as food waste, energy independence, or local sustainability. Entries are due on February 7th 2025. Don't wait to sign up, create and submit your videos at National Geographic's Videos for Change. Winners can earn up to \$10,000 in funding from National Geographic.

Beyond School Bells is committed to helping students share their solutions with afterschool and summer programs in 2025 with mini grants of up to \$5,000. Slingshot Challenge submissions are a requirement for funding. BSB has pre-packaged materials and dedicated support for solutions for food systems, energy, conservation, and many other local environmental opportunities.
