- 2) You have a 55-year-old male teacher collapse in the hallway with a possible medical issue...
- 3) You just hear an EXPLOSION; you think it was in the Cafeteria...
- 4) You hear the town emergency sirens sound...there is a rumor of a CHEMICAL spill in town...
- 5) You hear over the speaker: "Evacuate to the Evacuation Site" with no other details...
- 6) A Non-Custodial parent/guardian just picked up your student...




