### **ELO Innovation Invitational**





Youth-driven. Fun and engaging. Career Connected. Community-powered and sustained.

These are some of the takeaways from the second ELO Innovation Invitational that Beyond School Bells hosted on March 5th – 6th at the University of Nebraska Lincoln's Innovation Campus Conference Center.

Over 260 afterschool program staff and community advocates attended during the two-day conference, which focused on how we can go beyond current practice and create more high quality, cost-effective and locally sustainable Afterschool and Summer programs so that all Nebraska youth have access to affordable programs in their communities. With summer just around the corner, the conference also explored partnership opportunities that are available in every Nebraska community to provide the community-rich learning experiences that young people crave – and afterschool and summer programs are ideally positioned to provide.

Another key theme was career connected learning, including both opportunities for elementary and middle school students to explore the careers that will power their home town's futures and, for high school students, the opportunity to get hands on work experience helping to design and staff programs serving students across the state.

We want to thank everyone who attended and engaged in this year's conference – you all made it a great learning experience!



### **ELO Awareness Week**

In conjunction with the ELO Innovation Invitational, BSB also hosted ELO Awareness Week at the Capitol, where informational about Expanded Learning Opportunity programs surrounded the 2nd floor Rotunda.

Senator Anna Wishart, a longtime champion of Afterschool and Summer programs, introduced <u>Legislative Resolution 315</u> declaring the week of March 4th – 8th ELO Awareness Week, and encouraging communities to come together to support this important work in their communities.

Multiple community teams visited the Capitol during their time in Lincoln participating at the ELO Innovation Invitational and met with their Senator and staff to discuss the important role that ELO programs are playing in communities across Nebraska.

For everyone unable to attend last week's gathering, we urge you to reach out to local elected officials to let them know how important Afterschool and Summer programs are to children, families and the vitality of every Nebraska community.

Joel Bramhall of Crete Cardinal CLC Named a National Afterschool Ambassador



Earlier this month, the Afterschool Alliance announced it had selected Joel Bramhall, the Director of Cardinal Community Learning Centers and Federal programs for Crete Public Schools, to serve as a 2024 Afterschool Ambassador. He is one of only 15 afterschool leaders in the country chosen for the honor this year. Afterschool Ambassadors continue working with local afterschool programs while serving a one-year Afterschool Ambassador term, working with community leaders and policy makers, organizing events, and in other ways growing support for the afterschool and summer learning programs families rely on.

"I am delighted to have the opportunity to work with the Afterschool Alliance to increase awareness and bolster support for afterschool and summer learning programs," said Bramhall. "I have witnessed firsthand the impact these programs have on Nebraska students and families, especially as they work to overcome challenges. That is especially important now, as many of students have ground to make up and afterschool programs can help them do that. BSB's 2024 Conservation Experience Application is Open



We are excited to announce the 2024 Conservation Experiences Afterschool initiative aimed at engaging high school students in conservation efforts across our state. Beyond School Bells is

offering a series of conservation experiences designed to inspire students to become environmental stewards and explore local career paths in conservation.

Through half- to full-day experiences, students will have the opportunity to connect with conservation professionals, participate in hands-on activities, and develop valuable skills that will benefit them both personally and professionally. From wildlife conservation to sustainable agriculture, these experiences will provide students with a deeper understanding of the importance of conservation and the role they can play in protecting our planet. BSB will coordinate support for small groups (3-5 students) of high school students to travel to local conservation experiences this spring and summer.
